Week 2: Psalms of Lament

What do you think of when you think of the word "lament"?

- "Lament" in the Psalms
- The movement of a lament

One expression we frequently see used in the Psalms of Lament is, "how long?" but that is often followed by an expression of faith.

<u>Psalm 13</u>

- ¹ How long, LORD? Will you forget me forever? How long will you hide your face from me?
- ² How long must I wrestle with my thoughts and day after day have sorrow in my heart? How long will my enemy triumph over me?
- ⁵ But I trust in your unfailing love; my heart rejoices in your salvation.
- ⁶ I will sing the LORD's praise, for he has been good to me.

Psalm 35

- ¹⁷ How long, Lord, will you look on? Rescue me from their ravages, my precious life from these lions.
- ¹⁸ I will give you thanks in the great assembly; among the throngs I will praise you.

Often, but not always, the Psalms of Lament follow the pattern:

- 1. An address to God
- 2. An expression of the lament or complain
- 3. A confession of confidence in God, trust
- 4. A petition or request
- 5. Words of praise or confession of faith

<u>Psalm 77</u>

- vv. 1-4 He calls out to God (an invocation or address to God)
- vv. 5-6 What is he recalling when he says this?
- vv. 7-9 A series of 5 questions (We feel that sometimes, don't we?)
- vv. 10-20 A remembrance of the Lord's work in the life of His people

Psalms 42 & 43 - one lament

Psalm 42

- vv. 1-3: Lament
- v. 4: Lament or Faith?
- v. 5-7: Lament
- v. 8: Faith/Hope (even though he acknowledges God as his Rock)
- v. 11: Faith/Hope

Psalm 43

- v. 1: Appeals to God as a judge, "vindicate me"
- v. 2: Express of faith, lament
- **v. 3**: guide me, lead me
- v. 4: promise of praise
- v. 5: lament, expression of faith

The psalmist uses the same words of lament in three places: 42:5, 42:11, 43:5.

Psalm 44

- vv. 1-8
- vv. 9-16
- vv. 17-22

vv. 23-26

This psalm encourages us to face the difficult questions of life
