MENTAL WELLNESS SERIES AT ST. MICHAEL

It doesn't matter if you call it clinical depression, seasonal affective disorder, or just "winter," the fact is that depression is a part of our lives. We will discuss the relationship between depression and faith, and the most elusive thing when we are suffering, namely, hope in Christ. Presenter: Rev. Dr. Todd A. PEOPLE OF THE OLD TESTAMENT BIBLE STUDY

WEEKLY READING PLAN: JANUARY 21-27, 2024

Becoming more like Jesus – growing in His Word, Genesis 6-10

As you read about God's creation in the opening chapters of Genesis, by the time you get to chapter 6 God is ready to destroy it all. Things have gotten that bad. While we read about the flooding of the earth in chapter 6, it's didn't happen immediately after creation. Look again at Gen 5:28-32.

In Gen 6:6, we read where things were so bad that, "the Lord was sorry that he had made man on the earth, and it grieved him to his heart." Human emotions are used here to express the pain that God experienced when He saw the corruption of humanity. Man's sin was (and still is) God's sorrow.

God's patience gives way to His judgment. However, God's growing impatience with His creation didn't happen overnight. In fact, remember the words of 2 Pet 3:9, "The Lord is not slow to fulfil His promise as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance."

You've heard it said, "actions speak louder than words." If that is true, what do Noah's actions reveal about his character and his relationship with God as he starts to build the ark?

It is said of Noah that he, "found favor in the eyes of the Lord" (v. 8) and the very next verse goes on to tell us that he was "a righteous man and blameless in his generation" (v. 9). However, that doesn't mean that Noah was perfect. You will read otherwise in chapter 9.

Chapter 10 | "Known as the Table of Nations, this account fills the gap in history between Noah and Abraham, emphasizes the brotherhood of man, shows the relation of the Semitic nations in the broader region, and builds on this foundation for the history of redemption" (From The Lutheran Study Bible). As you read about the locations where these people lived, which ones can you find on a Bible map? What do you notice about the spread and movement of these people?

Once you complete your reading of Gen 1-10, take a look at the summary video from The Bible Project of the first 11 chapters to help fill in the blanks about what you've read: https://bibleproject.com/explore/video/genesis-1-11/.

"Noah and the Flood" - Genesis 6-9 (selected verses)

The R for the flood.

- "The Lord saw how great the wickedness of the human race had become on the earth, and that every inclination of the thoughts of the human heart was only evil all the time." (6:5)
- "Now the earth was corrupt in God's sight and was full of violence. God saw how corrupt the earth had become, for all the people on earth had corrupted their ways." (6:11-12)
- "My Spirit will not contend with humans forever, for they are mortal; their days will be a hundred and twenty years." (6:3)

The R from the flood.

- "But Noah found favor in the eyes of the Lord." (6:8)
- "So make yourself an ark of cypress wood . . . (6:14)
- "But I will establish my covenant with you, and you will enter the ark you and your sons and your wife and your sons' wives with you." (6:18)

The R_____ of the flood.

- "So Noah came out, together with his sons and his wife and his sons' wives. All the animals and all the creatures . . . came out of the ark, one kind after another. Then Noah build an altar to the Lord . . . 'Never again will I curse the ground because of humans . . . And never again will I destroy all living creatures, as I have done." (8:18-21)
- "Then God blessed Noah and his sons, saying to them, 'Be fruitful and increase in number and fill the earth . . . Everything that lives and moves about will be food for you. Just as I gave you the green plants, I now give you everything." (9:1, 3)

The R_____ of the flood.

• "But about that day or hour no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. As it was in the days of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. For in the days before the flood, people were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, up to the day Noah entered the ark; and they knew nothing about what would happen until the flood came and took them all away. That is how it will be at the coming of the Son of Man." (Matthew 24:36-39)
