WEEKLY READING PLAN for MARCH 10-16, 2024 Exodus 12-17

Becoming more like Jesus – growing in His Word

As we continue our focus on Old Testament Biblical characters, we turn to Moses this week. Moses may be one of the most well-known OT figures – the burning bush, leading the people of Israel out of Egypt, receiving the Ten Commandments on Mount Sinai, and more. Our OT reading plan this year will not cover every chapter in the OT, although you are encouraged to read as much as you want! However, considering the focus of this week's sermon, the chapters below help to tell the broader story of what Pastor Goff preached on this weekend. As time permits, read the broader story of what takes place before and after what we heard in this week's message.

Chapter 12 | Reading and understanding the Passover event is extremely helpful in comprehending the significance of the occasion where Jesus celebrated the Passover with His disciples at the Last Supper. How does the Passover symbolism help in understanding the meaning of the Lord's Supper today? After reading about the Passover, what insights does that offer to you as you celebration Holy Communion?

Chapters 13-14 | After the ten plagues, it seemed like Pharaoh has had enough. However, in reading 14:5, apparently he won't give up. Notice what Pharaoh was most concerned about based on what he said in v. 5. As the Egyptians came after the Israelites, notice the reaction of the Israelites in vv. 11-12. Why would they say this? As you read on, notice how Moses handles their complaints. Retrace the movement from fear (14:10-12) to faith (14:29-31). What was instrumental here? What do you think it meant to the Israelites that the same sea which "piled up" in their favor also destroyed the Egyptians?

Chapter 15 | What emotions does the "song of Moses and Miriam" reflect? What main idea does each stanza of this song reinforce? What was Miriam's role in this celebration? Following their celebration, notice how quickly the people have gone from *prison to praise to protest*. What does this say about our human reaction to God's work?

Chapter 16 | Given the miraculous escape from Egypt, how do you account for the people complaining so soon? What does this say about their relationship with God? As far as the manna, why provide food that lasts only one day? What was different about the sixth and seventh days? What does this say about the trust relationship God desires?

Chapter 17 | How does the first part of this chapter compare to 16:1-4? Why do you think God waited until the people complained before causing water to come out of the rock? Was thirst the only problem? What is the deeper problem here?
