READING PLAN for MARCH 17-23, 2024 Exodus 18-24

Becoming more like Jesus – growing in His Word

This weekend we take a week off from our Old Testament character focus as we have Lutheran Hour Speaker, Rev. Dr. Michael Zeigler with us as our guest preacher. Nevertheless, continue your reading in Exodus. For our Old Testament reading this weekend we hear from Exodus 18.

Chapter 18 | From you have read so far, what can you infer was Moses' job description? When Moses' father-in-law suggested he go about things differently, what were the key elements of Jethro's plan? As Jethro suggested that Moses find other people to help him, what kind of characteristics or qualities did Jethro suggest that they have?

Chapter 19 | Why do you think so much emphasis is placed on barring people from the mountain (v.12-13; 21-24; see also Num. 3:28)? Why the special effects (dense cloud, thunder, lightning, trumpet blast, smoke, etc.)?

Chapter 20 | What does it mean that God is a "jealous" God? Restate each of the Ten Commandments positively, or in the affirmative and see if that helps to appreciate or better understand the intent of each one.

Chapters 21-24 | As you read these chapters, what do you think about some of the regulations that are described here?
