WEEKLY READING PLAN for April 7-13, 2024 Joshua 1-6 Be

Becoming more like Jesus - growing in His Word

We took a few weeks off (because of Holy Week) from our regular plan of reading through various sections of the Old Testament. But now, let's continue. This weekend we turn to the character Joshua. After Moses led the children of Israel to the entrance of the promised land, Joshua is chosen by God to continue the journey. For some additional background, you may want to read Numbers 13-14 where Joshua and Caleb spy out the promised land and bring a report back.

Joshua 1 | As Israel's new leader, what are the words that were spoken to Joshua four times in this first chapter (see vv. 6, 7, 9, 18)?

Joshua 2 | Rahab may not seem like someone God would use to carry out His plan, and yet what she did was very significant. Her faith is commended in Hebrews 11:31 and James 2:25.

Joshua 3 | Reflect on the message this weekend that covered chapter 3.

Joshua 4 | What was the purpose of the twelve "memorial" stones? What are "memorials" today that help us remember what God has done in our life?

Joshua 5 | Who is the "man" referenced in v. 13? In the next verse he is referred to as "commander." The Hebrew word here can refer to a "representative of a king, an official, a leader, a military or civilian official." Whoever he was, he was there to help provide success for the battle.

Joshua 6 | Joshua announces to the people that the Lord has given Jericho over to them. What might be the reason for having the people march around the city once a day for six days and then seven times on the seventh day? How might this be beneficial for the people? How might this be difficult for them?
