Reading through the New Testament—Week 37 September 17-23

Becoming more like Jesus-growing in His Word

This week and next, our reading includes the two letters Paul wrote to the Thessalonians.

Thessalonica was a large and important city of the Roman Empire. As the gospel began to be shared there, it was often received with fierce opposition and persecution from the Jews. Paul was worried how the congregation would stand up under the constant resistance.

Paul sent Timothy to Thessalonica to encourage and strengthen the young Christian congregation there. Timothy later reported back to Paul about how things were going. Not only were the believers in Thessalonica remaining faithful, but they were actively spreading the gospel elsewhere. In his letters, Paul wanted the Thessalonians to know how thankful he was for their faithfulness and continued to encourage them. It is believed that Paul's first letter to the Thessalonians was one of the first, if not the very first, of Paul's letters.

Paul spends the first half of 1 Thessalonians expressing his love and concern for his fellow Christians there. In the second half of the letter, he encourages the Christians not to be idle. Apparently, they had the mistaken notion that Christ's second coming was imminent and didn't need to do anything except wait for that day.

In 2 Thessalonians, Paul again warns against idleness but he also focuses on the eager anticipation of Christ's second coming. Maybe the most famous part of 2 Thessalonians deals with the coming of the Antichrist. Of Paul's two letters to the Thessalonians, no other teaching has been subject to so much misinterpretation and speculation.



Additional Reflections from this week's reading

Colossians 4 Read vv. 2-6. What role does prayer, thankfulness, wise actions, graceful (even salty) talk – play in advancing the message of the gospel?

1 Thessalonians 1 Read about Paul's experiences with the Thessalonian church in Acts 17:1-9.

1 Thessalonians 2 List all the characteristics of a faithful Christian worker and witness referenced in this chapter. Of those, which do you possess? Which do you want to develop? Who has been a positive example to you of such characteristics?

1 Thessalonians 3 What in Timothy's report particularly encourages Paul? What does this tell you about Paul's desires and concerns for the Thessalonians?

1 Thessalonians 4 Read what vv. 13-18 say about the return of Jesus.

Blessing the World

Belonging in Community

Connect Groups are a group of Christians who meet together regularly where we intentionally share in our faith walk. Connection is created through commitment and presence in fellowship, discussion, and prayer.

- Begin your time together by following up on anything that was shared during your last time together.
- Take some time to share any reflections of aha's you had from your reading.

As we read Colossians, 1 Thessalonians, and hear from our school theme of Connected John 15:5, we can notice how in each area of scripture we are encouraged to be about the work of Christ and His kingdom.

Colossians 4:5-6 Speaks to our behavior and interactions with those who do not yet know Jesus. What actions or inactions does this look like in your daily life?

1 Thessalonians 1:3 speaks about our "work produced by faith, your labor prompted by love, and your endurance inspired by hope in our Lord Jesus Christ." Share an example of a community where you witnessed work produced by faith, a community with labor prompted by love, and a community where you witnessed endurance inspired by hope. What was it like to be a part of those communities? How can your community take further steps to be more like this?

John 15:1-7 talks about being connected and growing fruit so that others may know about Him. We pondered in the sermon this week how the branches reach out and connect with its surroundings so that the vine can be lifted up and actually bear fruit. How are you reaching out and connecting so that Jesus, the vine, can be known through you?

As you close, spend time in prayer asking God to continue to bring you into connection with the kingdom work that He is doing in, through, and around you.
