WEEKLY READING GUIDE | April 29-May 3

Introduction to the Book of Ruth

Ruth takes place amid the tumultuous events during the time of Judges and before the Israelite tribes unite as a formal kingdom. Although no author is identified, Jewish tradition credits the book to the prophet Samuel, who anointed David as God's chosen king. This historical account describes events approximately 126 years before David's birth and establishes David's ancestry by the story of two widows, Naomi and Ruth, who have their unfortunate circumstances redeemed after a chance encounter with a relative named Boaz.
