Theme of the Day: Fifty days following the resurrection of Jesus is the day of Pentecost. Jesus promised the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon His people, both then and now. As we have been taught in Martin Luther's Small Catechism, "I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith."

Becoming more like Jesus - growing in His Word

This weekend we observed the festival of Pentecost. Therefore, there was no particular Old Testament person that we recognized.

- **1 Samuel 20** | What does it take for Jonathan to finally catch on to his father's true intent with regard to David?
