# GIVE THANKS...LIVE THANKS!

There are two short words that, when they come together, are very powerful: THANK YOU!

It's too bad that we often leave the positive power of this expression untapped. Too often we take people for granted and leave unsaid what we think the other person knows. That's not only too bad, it's not right.

I've often noticed—but it has hit home again recently—how our grandchildren say, "Thank you." They say it often. Un-coached. Regularly. Sincerely. I'm not only happily impressed but moved by this and how it has become a basic part of their interactions and their hearts. It reminds me how important it is for all of us to respond this way.

What a easy way to model grateful behavior! It makes an imprint when others hear these words and see their effects. It makes a difference. People watch and listen and, consciously or not, an impression is made that works its way into their attitude and behavior. When we were little, most of us were taught by our parents to say, "Please" and "Thank you." No doubt, this teaching made a difference, and even more so if we had parents and others around us saying, "Thank you."

"Thank you" rubs off; what we hear from those around us rubs off on us. I've noticed that when people are around fellow workers, for example, who have a foul mouth and often use God's name in vain, that they begin to talk this way—a little, or after time a lot. Good, wholesome talk also rubs off, and that's the kind of thing we can make happen.

We have so much to be thankful for and to express it is a great thing. It makes a difference. It brings out and reenforces good in other people. Iit feels good to both parties.

The Bible encourages us to give thanks to God and to others.

Ephesians 5:20 ....Always give thanks to God the Father for everything....

Philippians 4:6 ....but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God.

1 Thessalonians 5:19 Give thanks in all circumstances.

These aren't just commands; they are reminders and encouragements to say the words "Thank you" but also to live thanks. Give thanks and live thanks. This changes people, starting with ourselves. I think that these two words are very powerful, most appreciated, and transformative. Speaking them is one of the best expressions coming from our hearts and through our mouths.

### SPECIAL THANKS!

This month, we not only say "Thanks" but also "Goodbye" to Pastor Don Sandmann. Gratefully, but not forever, it's only "Goodbye" from St. Michael and his ministry here. He's been Assistant to the Pastor/Visitation Pastor among us for five years, but he's been led to step away from this important ministry. # THOUGHTS FROM CELINE



Welcome to February! Here's a fun fact—this month, we will be able to celebrate twosday. You read that right. 2/2/22 will be on a Tuesday or as I will be calling it twosday! There are a few other commemoration days and events happening this month: The Winter Olympics, several other big games in sports, Valentine's Day, Presidents' Day, possibly even an anniversary or birthday! Why mention this? These are great opportunities for us to live out our spiritual practice for the month of February—COMMUNITY.

Not that we need a special reason to gather...community is good anytime! It's something we have been missing out on. The practice of separation has been heightened for the past couple of years. The divisiveness in public opinion has an ever-growing presence, and a surge in online connection is taking more and more time in our relationships. However, this problem is not just a recent phenomenon. In his book "Bowling Alone," Robert Putnam points out that the decline of community that we are experiencing is seen in every kind of community for decades. Reports of loneliness and lack of connection continue to rise, and we don't need a study to point out the evidence and the cost that is all around us.

Community is a group of people who 1) live in the same area 2) have the same interest. Living in community is allowing those in our community access to us...sharing of our thoughts and feelings and making room for the other with our time and our space.

In his ministry, Jesus consistently took time to be in community with people, and he intentionally shared their space. In his most intimate community of 12 disciples, he shared his deepest thoughts and feelings. He made friends, he ate meals, he prayed with others, he went to parties. This wasn't just Jesus being Jesus. It shows us how to live as God designed—in community.

One thing I want us all to hear is **keep trying**. I know the disappointment of working hard to schedule a gathering, and then hear that the guest list has been cut in half because of people who are isolating or in quarantine. This is not a prompt to forgo healthy precaution and practices, but it is an encouragement to keep scheduling things. Commit to being with people, and when that changes, reschedule. Being with others is a part of God's design, and it is important.

In the spirit of embracing community as a spiritual practice, here is a suggestion for this month:

- Choose a community that you belong to. This can be a Bible study group, another small group at church, your work team, a group of friends, your neighbors, your family, etc.
- Contemplate these questions: What can I do to deepen my relationships, even just a little bit? What can I do to brighten someone's day? How can I love more? How can I be more authentic? How can I intentionally engage in this community again?
- Choose one or two of the answers that come up for you, and go do it.




