CONNECT WITH PASTOR GOFF



It's good to be here! Laura and I thank you for the warm reception you've shown us so far and the wonderful celebration you hosted for my installation on September 25. We feel blessed to serve the Lord and his church here with you at St. Michael!

St. Michael Lutheran Church and School is obviously a vibrant ministry and is blessed with many incredible people. With everything that happens here on a daily basis, it will take a while for me to navigate all the various ministries (and putting names and faces together), so continue to be patient with me!

So now, where do I begin? It's probably not surprising for me as a pastor to say this, but I think the best place to begin is in God's Word. With that in mind, I want to introduce you to the sermon series I am beginning this month as well as the adult Bible class on Sunday morning. First, the sermon series. I have come to believe how important it is for a congregation to be clear about who they are and where they are headed. One thing that guides that is a mission statement. A mission statement is not something to develop and never refer back to, but rather for everything we do to flow out of it. I don't mind saying that I think the mission statement of St. Michael is a clear and concise one. Why are we here? We are here to **connect people to Jesus**. Through the ministry of ESM, through the worship services, through visitations, through small groups, through music ministry, through Bible classes and Sunday school, through mission trips, through youth ministry, through senior ministry, and everything else – everything we do is about connecting people to Jesus.

With that in mind, I am beginning a sermon series this fall entitled, "Connecting People to Jesus." Each week we will unpack different examples of how Jesus connected with people, which serves as a model for us as well. When Jesus said, "I am the vine, you are the branches," (John 15:5) he was talking about connections between us and him. I look forward to exploring those connections with you this fall.

Secondly, I am beginning a Sunday morning Bible study on the book of Psalms that I'm calling, "Why the Psalms?" In addition to looking at why the Psalms still have meaning for our life today, we will explore the different kinds of Psalms, how to read them, how to pray the Psalms, where we see Jesus in the Psalms, etc. I pray you will be a part of that study as we connect with each other through God's Word.

Again, it's great to be here! I look forward to our relationship together, as together we connect people with Jesus.

ACADEMY OF THE ARTS

"Music expresses that which cannot be put into words and that which cannot remain silent." Victor Hugo

There are so many benefits to learning an instrument at a young age, or any age! Here are a few:

- 1. **Teaches Patience**. Playing an instrument means persevering through practice, even on the days when it is not fun.
- 2. Creates Responsibility. Students learn how to care for their instrument and set aside time to practice.
- 3. **Boosts Self-esteem**. Learning an instrument provides kids an outlet to practice, receive feedback, make adjustments and see positive change. Students have a sense of accomplishment as they experience the positive results of hard work and perseverance.
- 4. **Enhances Coordination**. Playing an instrument improves hand-eye coordination as students concentrate on reading music and then converting the notes into the physical motion of playing.
- 5. **Promotes Math Skills**. Music and math are very connected! Kids learn how to divide measures into beats, understand time signature, and the intervals between notes.
- 6. **Increases Memory Capacity.** Music teaches kids to create, store, and retrieve memoires; similar to a work out for the brain. Take learning the guitar as an example: students have to memorize which strings correspond with which notes and how to play chords with specific hand position.
- 7. **Aids Social Skills.** Kids learn that by putting instruments together they can create music they cannot play on their own. Students learn how to respect the gifts and skills of other musicians.
- 8. **Exposes New Cultures.** Music is a reflection of history. Students learn about the cultures that created different genres of music like jazz, blues, classical, and baroque.
- 9. **Improves Language Development.** As children learn how to distinguish different pitches, they also learn to distinguish differences between spoken words.
- 10. **Opportunity to Praise!** Music provides opportunity to give God honor and praise! Miriam, King David, and Mary are just a few examples of the people who used music as an offering to the Lord. Music helps us convey emotions in a way that words cannot.

THOUGHTS FROM CELINE

I recently had a discussion with my counselor about making changes and putting the behaviors we want into practice. We talked about what it takes to be intentional about the change we are trying to achieve. The first step is becoming aware of the behavior we don't want. Frustratingly, this awareness often comes after the fact. We can look back and see what we *could* have done...what we *should* have done. It is easy to get discouraged. To be tempted to stop trying. Or even giving in and going to the extreme of pulling away and disengaging from the situation or even more drastic - from the people.

What is our response when we are aware of the wrong that has been done? Forgiveness.

Forgiveness is one of the most important; if not THE most important gift we have been given. And it is one of the most important gifts that we are to put into practice. "Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you." Ephesians 4:32

Why is forgiveness necessary? It allows for a way forward. Think of this - what way forward would we have if we were never given forgiveness through Christ? We would have to go back and correct every instance where we failed to be perfect. And we would have to repair the trust and brokenness in the relationship with God by continuing to be perfect. Otherwise the process would begin again. This is not just unlikely - it's impossible. So - God created another way forward. He forgave.

And that is what we are commanded to do as Christians. It is important to note that **forgiveness is letting go of the past things that are owed to us**. It does not mean that the relationship is instantly safe, whole, or that we have to immediately let someone who has hurt us back into our lives. That is the work of reconciliation (a whole other topic). Forgiveness provides a way for reconciliation to begin. Forgiveness is what allows for us to work towards connection instead of letting sin push us apart.

Like any discipline it is a "muscle" that we can exercise. The more we use it. The more easily we can forgive. And the more we forgive the closer we become to those in our lives because we are not letting the debts of the past get in our way. It will never be easy though. Forgiveness is a choice we make in the face of real hurt and brokenness. There are those who have damaged us in our childhood, those who have stolen our chance at opportunities for the life we have worked and hoped for. Those whose anger, envy, greed, distraction, ect. have caused seemingly reckless and careless loss. Those who seem to ignore the value of the people around them. There are also the deep destructive habits and choices we know in ourselves. The brokenness, damage, and loss that we have caused. Even as I write this I can feel the weight of it all.

So - first, hear these words. You are forgiven. For every misstep you have taken. For the hurt you have caused. For every time you have failed to reach the ideal and it caused pain. You are forgiven.

Next - think of something "small" that weighs on you. It may be that person who cut you off while driving, or the way someone spoke to you recently. And practice letting it go and giving it away to Jesus. And when the weight comes again, it likely will, give it away again. Actively choose a heart posture that *refuses* to hang onto those wrongs. As the "muscle" grows you will be able to make the choice in bigger and heavier situations. Working towards forgiveness in those deep wounds. Knowing that every step of the way the Spirit is with you, giving you all things necessary for forgiveness to be your way of life.

STEWARDSHIP and year-end giving

CASH GIFTS

A cash gift in any amount is a convenient and popular way to show your faithful support for the church or other ministries. If you itemize, the full amount of your gift qualifies for a 2022 charitable income tax deduction. Make certain your check is dated 2022 and received or postmarked no later than December 31, 2022, to receive a deduction this year.

GIVING APPRECIATED PROPERTY

If you own investments that have increased in value (stocks, bonds, real estate, or mutual funds), you can donate them to a church or charity and take a charitable income tax deduction for the full fair market value and avoid declaring the capital gain of the assets as income. Many people consider this the equivalent of a "double deduction."

GIVING & RETAINING INCOME FOR LIFE

Did you know you can give to a charity while retaining income from the gift for the rest of your life? A charitable gift annuity or charitable remainder trust enables you to receive flexible or guaranteed income.

GIVING UNNEEDED LIFE INSURANCE

Do you own an old life insurance policy that is no longer needed? Consider giving the policy to the church or a charity and receive a charitable income tax deduction for the lesser of your cost basis or the replacement value. This is a great way to benefit a cause you support without reducing your checking account.

WISE TAX PLANNING

Making extra gifts or accelerating future gifts into the 2022 tax year can enable an itemized income tax deduction. The standard deduction threshold for 2022 is \$25,900 for joint filers, \$19,400 for heads of households and \$12,950 for singles (\$1750/person 65+, \$2800 if joint return, \$1,750 if unmarried). If your total deductions are less than those amounts, you won't be able to deduct any charitable gifts. An extra year-end gift may add just enough to allow you to take advantage of your full itemized deduction. Many tax-wise donors accelerate contributions for the coming year to enable itemization at least every other year.
