Warmest Advent and Christmas greetings from the pastors and leadership team of St. Michael Lutheran Church!

CONNECT WITH PASTOR GOFF

Thank you to the 100 people who attended the congregation meeting last month (November 19). The food and fellowship were great, and there was a spirit of unity among those attending as we reviewed various aspects of our ministry together. The following is a summary of what I shared as a part of the Senior Pastor's report.

- 1. Statistical Report. A printed report was distributed with information on membership, attendance, giving, etc. There were two things I highlighted. One is that our baptized and communicate membership shows a decrease because there has been an intentional effort to contact people who we have not seen in several years. Many of those contacts have gone unanswered and there are some people who we no longer have contact information on. Nevertheless, so far in 2023, we have received 72 new members. Secondly, our average worship attendance has increased over the past few years. For 2023 our average weekend attendance is 501, not including those worshipping online.
- 2. Organizational Priorities. While I was interviewed for the senior pastor position, there were four areas of priority I heard repeated from the Call Committee, Church Council, Elders, and Staff needing attention.
 - a. **Ministry Strategy**. We are working on further clarification, but our overall ministry strategy is designed around our mission statement: *"Connecting people to Jesus and others."* And to carry that out, our discipleship model is: *Becoming More Like Jesus, Belonging to His Church, and Blessing His World*.
 - b. **Church Governance**. A few months ago, the Church Council authorized our work with an outside consultant, Jim Galvin of Galvin and Associates, to guide us through a review of our church governance model and By-Laws. There will be more information about this after the first of the year. Our goal is to complete this process the first half of 2024.
 - c. **Facility Review**. While there was already work started on this prior to the senior pastor vacancy, we will soon continue to assess facility needs and/or improvements on our church and school buildings. Our principal, Dr. Ben Stellwagen, and Assistant Principals at St. Michael's campus, Keri Latin and Jennifer Ackmann, will be included in this process as well. Our goal is to begin this process the first half of 2024.
 - d. **Ministry Staff**. I am thankful for a dedicated, gifted, and servant hearted ministry staff at St. Michael. As we further clarify our ministry strategy, we will also assess our overall staffing needs. Our goal is to complete that process by the end of 2024.
- 3. Missional Pastor Pastor Shawn's Ministry Realignment. Pastor Shawn and I had some Q and A time at the meeting to further unpack his ministry realignment beginning in 2024. The word "realignment" means that with two full-time pastors we are now able to realign his ministry focus back to what it was intended to be when St. Michael called Pastor Shawn as our missional pastor. The focus of his ministry will be working with and among young adults those connected with St. Michael, as well as young adults in the community who may not have any church connection. Additionally, Pastor Shawn will continue to oversee our Acts 1:8 mission and ministry partnerships.
- **4. St. Michael Website**. Work is underway to update/revamp our church website. Our goal is to have this completed in Spring 2024.
- 5. St. Michael 70th Jubilee Anniversary. The year 2024 marks the 70th anniversary of St. Michael Lutheran Church. While the word "jubilee" used in the Old Testament was a reference to something that happened every 50 years, it is not uncommon to have a "jubilee" celebration at other numerical intervals as well. You will see more throughout 2024 highlighting our 70th anniversary.
- 6. Sermon Series for 2024. The theme we will highlight for our 70th anniversary next year is "Jubilee: Set Free to Tell the Story." The preaching focus throughout 2024 (with a few exceptions), will focus on a number of Old Testament characters who were a part of God's salvation story down through the ages that has become our salvation story. Similarly, over the last 70 years there have been countless people connected to St. Michael who have been a part of "telling the salvation story" here. We are all a part of, and continue to share in, that legacy.

7. Construction Project Across the Street. In case you don't know the particulars of the construction project across the street, there is a 322-unit apartment complex being built. The first buildings are slated to be completed by late Spring of 2024 and the entire project is to be complete by Fall of 2025. I shared the concern that at this time there are no plans for a traffic light or other traffic control at our entrance, but we are petitioning the appropriate agency to reconsider that. However, I do want to highlight that this building project presents an opportunity for us to be the presence of Jesus to people who will make their home across the street. We will be exploring, and praying about, how to live out our mission of *"Connecting people to Jesus and others"* with our new neighbors.

Those are the highlights from my report to the congregation at last month's meeting. If you have any questions or need clarification about anything here, please contact me.


