CONNECT WITH PASTOR GOFF

Recently I got new glasses. As soon as I walked out of the optical office I knew something wasn't right. My vision was blurry. (I'm pretty sure that's not what's supposed to happen when you get new glasses!) It didn't take long for me to figure out what was wrong. I have progressive lenses but the prescription in the lenses wasn't lined up correctly. If I look straight out, my vision was blurry. But, if I tilted my head a certain way, then I could see clearly. I immediately went back and requested an adjustment. Whether you wear corrective lenses or not, you know that when your vision is blurry everything seems distorted.


Later this month, we enter the season of Lent. Lent is especially a time in the church where the focus of our vision is on repentance and self-reflection. However, as baptized people our repentance and self-reflection is done through the lens of God's mercy. With that in mind, our Lenten theme this year is **"In View of God's Mercy"** from Romans 12:1-2; *"Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God . . . be transformed by the renewing of your mind . . ."*

Daily we battle with sin. We cannot, nor will we ever, defeat the enemy (the devil, the world, our own sinful flesh). But even as we struggle with sin, we deal with it **"in view of God's mercy"** because of the victory of Jesus given to us. For the six Wednesdays in Lent, we will look at our lives through the lens of God's love toward us through Jesus. Here are the individual themes we will focus on in our mid-week services:

February 22 – Ash Wednesday "Repentance . . . In View of God's Mercy"
March 1 "Relationships . . . In View of God's Mercy"
March 8 "Betrayal . . . In View of God's Mercy"
March 15 "Temptation . . . In View of God's Mercy"
March 22 "Suffering . . . In View of God's Mercy"
March 29 "Service . . . In View of God's Mercy"

Two other notes about our mid-week Lent worship services:

- Each week there will be two worship times 11:00a and 7:00p
- On **Ash Wednesday, there will be a meal** at 12:00p (following the 11:00a worship service) and at 6:00p (prior to the 7:00p worship service.) Team Tandem, led by Mary and Jerry Nichols, will provide the noon lunch. The evening meal will be prepared and served by St. Michael high school youth and their parents. 
BEING CHRIST HANDS AND FEET

Matthew 25:25-46

"...For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me...'"

If you're following our New Testament reading plan one of the first readings in February, Jesus shares how we can be a part of his mission by being his hands and feet to those around us. As we move further into 2023, we are working to identify ways that we as a congregation can be the hands and feet of Christ to those in need in our communities.

One of those ways is to help with the needs of the hungry. Fort Wayne has several areas that could be considered food deserts. These are places around the city where residents live more than a mile away from affordable groceries and nutritional produce. We have several food pantries and partners-in-ministry that assist with the need for food in these areas.



This year we will concentrate on two organizations that are tackling food crises in our city: NINE (Northeast Indiana Neighborhood Engagement) and New Life Lutheran food pantry. Both are looking for nonperishable food items. 

THOUGHTS FROM CELINE

Recently, I was enjoying breakfast at Spyros, a nearby diner with delicious food and quality service. While enjoying company and conversation at the table I noted that my coffee cup was never less than halfway full. This wasn't due to my lack of drinking the coffee. Rather it was clear that the staff were trained to actively be on the lookout for anyone who needed a refill. If they had a pot of coffee in their hand and were walking across the dining room floor, they would take notice and approach politely to ask if we wanted more. Never forced or assumed, but always offered. We were never in need of more coffee.

What a beautiful and simple way of serving. Knowing that you have something to provide and as you go - being ready to give. Never forced or assumed, but always offered with kindness and respect. I began to wonder what it would look like if we were like that...if St. Michael was a place where we never let someone's cup go below halfway without offering to fill it up.



I do mean literal cups of coffee, but so much more as well. I also mean those metaphorical cups—self-esteem, importance, safety, belonging, value, connection, purpose. Those are big things and it is easy for us to think to ourselves, "I don't know that person. It might be awkward if I approach them." But think about that restaurant again. It is a very acceptable practice to expect only your server to be the one who is serving you. After all, you have formed a relationship with them and when you leave your tip, they are the ones that will receive it. But

then the customer's experience is completely reliant on the one server, and their skills, and the type of day they are having. Sometimes it will excel and sometimes it will fall short. If we allow ourselves to be dismissed from the responsibility of filling up someone's cup (because we don't know them or it's not our responsibility) then we are missing out on an opportunity to be the Church, the Body of Christ that meets the needs of those around and amongst us.

It is important that we remember that being amongst Christians doesn't mean that somehow magically and without cause, my cup is filled to the point of overflowing. It means that I am amongst a group of people that believe in the value of every person because of what Christ has done for them. It means that we choose actions that show we follow a teacher who, time and time again, stopped for those with low cups to fill them up.

At St. Michael, we have a mission to fill. To connect people to Jesus and to others. Let's continue and increase in our work to take notice when someone needs a hug, a smile, or recognition. Let's work towards remembering each other's names. Asking someone to join in for lunch plans. Let's take the time to learn about their families and their struggles and make a point of celebrating milestones and achievements. Let's be sure that they know where the bathrooms are and where to get the coffee and that they are invited to sit with us. Let's do this here at St. Michael as well as beyond these walls.

Be hospitable to one another without complaining. Based on the gift each one has received; use it to serve others, as good managers of the varied grace of God.1 Peter 4:9-10

STEWARDSHIP

The following article was taken from the Christian Stewardship Network:



The start of a new year is always a great motivator to improve your finances. It's one of the top goals for Americans each year and a worthy one considering the state of our economy, a looming recession, and the growing uncertainty of the future. Regardless of where you find yourself

financially, these two components will ensure you succeed in managing your money well.

1. PUTTING GOD FIRST

Money is more than a medium of exchange to get the things you need or want in life. Just like everything else you possess, money is entrusted to us by God for our good and the good of others. More specifically, he assigns us money so we can carry out our responsibility and accomplish His will.



When our perspective about money changes from our money to His money, that's putting God first. When we seek his Kingdom and his righteousness as we make spending and giving decisions, we're putting God first. Every financial decision becomes a spiritual decision because we're not managing our money; we're managing God's money.

A practical way to put God first in your finances is to make a plan that honors God. My wife and I adjust our financial plan at the beginning of every year or whenever our income changes, up or down. The main attitude behind the decisions we make during this process is to talk to each other and pray for God to guide our decisions.

Putting God first for us means the first category in our plan is giving. We commit to supporting God's work by returning to God the first portion, which we give to our local church. Equally important to us is giving to the poor and organizations that promote and expand the gospel message in various ways.

2. MAKE AND LIVE BY A WRITTEN FINANCIAL PLAN

You've heard this before, but the national statistics aren't improving. Most Americans (Christians, too) live paycheck to paycheck, have little to no savings, and don't operate by a written financial plan, so I will keep revisiting this until these stats improve.

I don't care how brilliant you are and how great your memory is; you can't manage your financial life in your head! You need to have a written plan. No, it doesn't have to be complicated. But, without a plan, and one that gives you the confidence to make informed and wise decisions, you're going to keep living paycheck to paycheck, lack savings, and think that half of your expenses are emergencies when they're not.

Your financial plan should prioritize saving for the future, reducing existing debt so you can regain more of your income, and dividing the rest of your income into your family's different categories and needs like housing, food, clothing, and transportation.

Many apps and financial courses will help you with the details of creating and implementing a good financial plan. If you've procrastinated and continued to try and do this in your head, or some other way that hasn't worked, let 2023 be the year that all stops, and you get on a solid financial footing.

We serve a generous and compassionate God. No matter what financial state you find yourself in, whether struggling or soaring financially, God wants the best for you, and he's committed to your well-being and success. He is faithful to do his part, but he needs you to do your part so that his protection, favor, and blessing can be poured into your life.
